## OUR POWER

TLP POWER Lacrosse is a sport alternative program for Grades 7 to 12, operating in partnership with the Edmonton Public School Board. TLP Power has been created to provide a training ground to develop players into Canada's best and brightest lacrosse players. Student-athletes in the program combine their academic and lacrosse pursuits within the school environment. Student-athletes receive 200 hours of direct lacrosse instruction over the course of the school year.

TLP POWER Lacrosse provides Canadian youth lacrosse players with exposure to the traditional Canadian box lacrosse game as well as the field lacrosse game that is prevalent throughout the United States. Our goal is to create hybrid lacrosse players with the creativity of the box player combined with the discipline of the field player.

Our program has been extremely successful in developing strong students and lacrosse players. TLP Power boasts 16 players that have played at National Championships on Team Alberta in either box lacrosse or field lacrosse.

## POWER PLAN

- Late August to Late October - Field lacrosse skill development and introductory team tactics. Proposed field high school field lacrosse league.
- December - Attend Space Needle Shootout Tournament in Seattle.
- November to April - Box lacrosse skill development, individual tactics, and team tactics.
- May to June - Field lacrosse team tactics and systems. Exhibition high school field lacrosse games.
- July—Attend major lacrosse festival in Northeast US.
